
Berkshire Robotics Challenge

Modeled after the FIRST LEGO LEAGUE annual challenge, the Berkshire Robotics Challenge is an opportunity for children from third to eighth grade (ages 8-14) to develop their science, computer and coding skills while designing and programming a robot to complete a series of challenges. Students work in school-based teams or neighborhood teams toward a competitive goal while learning problem-solving, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

2025 was the 24th annual Berkshire Robotics Challenge which featured 27 teams and more than 250 students.









Future Innovators Summer Program

The Future Innovators Summer Program is an intensive experiential learning program designed to connect high school students with local businesses, explore systems thinking and human skills, and engage in technologies offered at the BIC.

For 2025 we are offering two sessions, one in Pittsfield and one in North Adams. We have accepted 33 rising Sophomores, representing 8 Berkshire County high schools (plus some home-schooled students) and have commitments from over a dozen industry mentors and volunteers.









Future Innovators Experiential Learning Days

Our Future Innovators Experiential Learning Days welcome students from across Berkshire County to experience STEM programming and explore technology in our state-of-the-art facilities. Field trips can be scheduled at either the BIC in Pittsfield or at BIC Works @ MoCA in North Adams.

In 2024 we hosted 219 students and have already hosted 156 students through the first half of 2025. This is often a first encounter with the BIC for students and teachers and many then participate in other BIC or BIC partner programming.










Innovation Interns

Through our Innovation Interns program, high school and college students learn about the BIC and its ecosystem, explore new technologies, and work closely with our team and our network.

It is a project-based experience that might introduce students to advanced manufacturing tools and design methodologies, or might have them explore the business case for a new venture. Students often get paired with local employers to better understand real-world applications of engineering skillsets, methods, design & support.
